Dongxue's Story

Q. Dongxue, why did you feel the need to reach out to A Friend 4U?

A: I was in a hard time. I am from another country, all my friends were from university; however, I am the only few left in Fort Collins. I am not good at social, not good at talking to strangers, which makes it hard to make friends outside of school. After I got married, and got pregnant, few friends thought it was dangerous for me to do lots of activities, so they stopped reaching out to me. I felt super isolated, and lonely, also because my husband was not at home or around most of the time. I went to a program called Life Choices, and they recommended A Friend 4U to me, so I called.

Q. Who was your Volunteer Friend, and how did your relationship with her develop/grow?

A. Morgan is my friend. She is super nice and listens to me. I really appreciate the time we spend together. Especially when I was pregnant, I was the only one at home, with nobody to talk with, all I did was go to appointments. I was really looking forward to meeting her and talking about what happening, and just talk. It was super nice that she came to my baby shower, and we had a wonderful time. After baby is here, she brought me gifts from the program, which are very helpful. We keep connected even after delivery, and I really appreciate what she is doing and she is willing to spend time with me.

Q. How did a friendship with Morgan benefit you?

A: For me, I feel there is always someone there I can talk with, whenever, whatever. I feel less lonely, and also I know if there is anything I need or any information I am looking for, there is someone there for me to ask questions instead wondering myself. I am happy that in a foreign country, I am having one more friend.

Q. Did Morgan connect you with any other opportunities in the community?

A: She registered for me to [go to] a community baby shower, and that was the best! I got so many samples, and gifts, and so much information from different programs, some information was really important, [...] and best wishes from all different people. I also won the bed for the baby, which saved me tons of money.

Q. What kinds of things have you and Morgan done together?

A: We normally met at coffee shop to talk and enjoy the relaxed environment. Sometimes, we met for lunch, and she recommended some good places to eat.
